GENERAL ORDER

The President of the United States and the Governor of the State of Oklahoma have declared a state of emergency in response to the spread of the novel coronavirus COVID-19. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has advised taking measures to slow the spread of the disease and precautions to reduce the possibility of exposure to the virus. It has been determined that gatherings of people pose a threat to public health and safety.

This Court continues to evaluate its response to the spread of COVID-19 and recognizes the need to assist in the preservation of public safety and health while effectively administering justice during this period of national emergency.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the United States Marshals Service and Court Security Officers are directed to ask the questions listed below to all visitors to the Courthouse, and to bar entry if they answer yes to any of the questions or show outward symptoms related to COVID-19:

- Have you been outside the State of Oklahoma in the last 14 days?
- Have you been asked to self-quarantine?
- Have you been diagnosed, or been in contact with anyone diagnosed, with COVID-19?
- Do you have any flu-like symptoms, including but not limited to a high fever above 100.4 degrees, shortness of breath, headaches, or a dry cough?

This General Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until further order of the Court.
