The U. S. Probation Office serves the U.S. District Court, Northern District of Okahoma, which includes 11 counties. The Probation Office currently has 36 employees, including 13 lines officers, six Special Offender Specialists, two POAs, and seven Probation Services Assistants. The management structure consists of the Chief, Deputy Chief, four Supervisory Probation Officers, and one Supervisory Probation Services Assistant.

Summary

The Special Offender Specialist will handle a caseload of intensive supervision cases, which will include sex offenders and other "special offenders," who may pose a unique threat to public safety. In addition, the Specialist performs the full range of duties and responsibilities of a U. S. Probation Officer at the CL 28 level.

Qualifications

To qualify for the position of Special Offender Specialist, the applicant must be a U. S. Probation Officer with at least three years of specialized experience, including at least one year as a CL-28. This position requires considerable technical expertise in the general work of probation officers. Must also have some knowledge of current research, programs, and practices of dealing with high-risk cases.

*Specialized Experience: Specialized experience is defined as progressively responsible experience, gained after completion of a bachelor's degree, in such fields as probation, pretrial services, parole, correction, criminal investigations, or work in substance/addiction treatment.

Court Preferred Qualification/Skills:

The incumbent must have working knowledge of Microsoft Word and automated systems, well developed written and verbal communication skills, superior organization skills, unquestioned integrity, maturity of judgement and tact. Also, the incumbent must have the capability to cope with a stressful workload and maintain a professional demeanor understressful situations. Knowledge of national policy related to sex offender management is desirable. Master's degree is preferred.
