The United States Probation Office serves the United States District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma, which includes 11 counties. The Probation Office currently has 44 employees, including 15 line officers, seven Special Offender Specialists, two Probation Officer Assistants, and support staff. The management structure consists of the Chief, Deputy Chief, five Supervisory Probation Officers, and one Probation Support Supervisor.

Summary

The Special Offender Specialist will handle a caseload of intensive post-conviction supervision cases, which could include sex offenders, persons with severe mental illness, juveniles and other "special offenders," who may pose a unique threat to public safety. In addition, the Specialist performs the full range of duties and responsibilities of a U. S. Probation Officer at the CL 28 level.

Qualifications

To qualify for the position of Special Offender Specialist, the applicant must be a U. S. Probation Officer with at least three years of specialized experience, including at least one year as a CL-28, and either a Master's Degree in a relevant field or a Juris Doctorate. This position requires considerable technical expertise in the general work of probation officers. The incumbent must also have some knowledge of current research, programs, and practices of dealing with high-risk cases.

*Specialized Experience: Specialized experience is defined as progressively responsible experience, gained after completion of a bachelor's degree, in such fields as probation, pretrial services, parole, correction, criminal investigations, or work in substance/addiction treatment.

Court Preferred Qualification/Skills:

The incumbent must have working knowledge of Microsoft Word and automated systems, well developed written and verbal communication skills, superior organization skills, unquestioned integrity, maturity of judgment and tact. Also, the incumbent must have the capability to cope with a stressful workload and maintain a professional demeanor under stressful situations. Knowledge of national policy related to sex offender management is desirable.
